## LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN INFORMATION

Extracts from the Scottish Government Directorate for Planning and Environmental Appeals (DPEA) website (FCC notes in red)

## **Commencement**

Planning authority submits proposed plan and supporting documentation to Ministers. Reporter(s) appointed. This has just been done.

A development plan examination normally takes around 6-9 months to complete.

## **Examination**

<u>Stage 1</u> Reporter examines conformity with participation statement. (i.e. has <u>Stirling Council done everything properly?</u>) When demonstrated, reporter proceeds to assess unresolved issues. <u>Fintry's situation is an unresolved issue</u>.

Stage 2 Examination of unresolved issues to the proposed plan commences when stage one is complete, but not before 28 days from the appointment of a reporter. Reporter examines unresolved issues, written requests for further information, possible site visits and hearings/inquiry as required. Which of these is done is the reporter's decision. Information about the current stage of an examination will be published on the <a href="DPEA case website">DPEA case website</a>.

Examination report published. We will be notified of this.

Planning Authority adopts local development plans including reporter's modifications (subject to limited exceptions). The reporter's recommendations are binding in all but a few limited circumstances.
